A4 Play is a biennial exhibition of A4 sized artwork by students of the Helpmann Academy's visual art partner schools: Adelaide Centre for the Arts (TafeSA), Adelaide Central School of Art, South Australian School of Art (UniSA) and Vizarts, O'Halloran Hill (TafeSA).

The exhibition consists of two-dimensional and three-dimensional A4 sized work exploring text, image, object and mark.

The artworks have been created by the students in direct response to the visual smorgasbord at this year's Artists' Week, part of the 2008 Adelaide Bank Festival of Arts.

A4 Play is a huge exhibition showcasing the work of almost 500 of South Australia's up and coming artists.
